Scleroderma is a chronic, often progressive disease in which the body's immune system attacks its own tissues. The disease, which literally means "hard skin," can result in thickening and tightening of the skin, as well as causing serious damage to internal organs. Scleroderma occurs three to four times more often in women than in men, and it can occur in children and the elderly.

Presently, scleroderma's cause is not known, and there is no cure.

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
