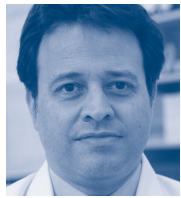


MARGRIT WIESENDANGER, MD, PHD

Topic: ***Scleroderma Symptoms and Management***

Dr. Wiesendanger is a graduate of the Albert Einstein College of Medicine in the Bronx, NY, where she earned a dual MD-PhD degree in the discipline of Immunology. She then completed a residency in Internal Medicine and fellowship in Rheumatology at the New York-Presbyterian Hospital/Columbia campus. Dr. Wiesendanger is board certified in both Rheumatology and Internal Medicine. She served on the faculty in the Division of General Medicine at NYPH-Columbia before joining the Division of Rheumatology at Mount Sinai Hospital in April 2015. Her patient care activities include the Mount Sinai Faculty Practice Associates and the Center for Advanced Medicine. She is the current Program Director for the rheumatology fellowship.

Dr. Wiesendanger has received several awards, including the prestigious Daniel V. Kimberg Memorial Junior Faculty Teaching Award and the Ewig Clinical Scholar Award. She is fluent in English, Spanish and French.



IOANNIS TASSIULAS, MD, PHD

Topic: ***Scleroderma Pathogenesis - Immunology and Treatment Approaches***

Dr. Tassioulas completed his residency in internal medicine at Albert Einstein Medical Center, his rheumatology fellowship at the Hospital for Special Surgery and a cellular and molecular immunology fellowship at the National Institute of Arthritis Musculoskeletal and Skin Diseases/NIH. He is an Associate Professor of Medicine in the Department of Rheumatology at Mount Sinai Hospital. His research interests focus on cytokine and immune receptor signaling in chronic inflammatory and autoimmune diseases.

Dr. Tassioulas has been a member of a task force of the European League Against Rheumatism standing committee for clinical affairs for the development of recommendations for the management of systemic lupus erythematosus. He is fluent in English and Greek.



MARIA L. PADILLA, MD

Topic: ***Lung Manifestations of Scleroderma***

Dr. Padilla is currently a Professor in the Department of Pulmonary and Critical Care and Sleep Medicine at Mount Sinai Hospital. After completing her pulmonary fellowship at Mount Sinai School of Medicine and The Mount Sinai Medical Center, she pursued her studies in lung transplantation by attending the programs at Toronto General Hospital and Stanford University. She was the co-founder of the program at Mount Sinai Hospital. During her fellowship training, Dr. Padilla conducted research in pathology, developing models of pulmonary diseases. She also participated in clinical research in sarcoidosis and interstitial lung diseases.

Dr. Padilla is board certified in Internal Medicine, Pulmonary Medicine, and Critical Care Medicine. She is the Director of Mount Sinai's Advanced Lung/Interstitial Lung Disease Program and the Medical Director of the Lung Transplantation Program. She is also involved in the Sarcoidosis Service and the adult Cystic Fibrosis program. She is a consultant to other transplant programs at Mount Sinai, and is also the principal investigator of clinical research projects. Dr. Padilla specializes in the treatment of diffuse interstitial lung diseases, including idiopathic interstitial pneumonia, acute interstitial pneumonia, lymphocytic interstitial pneumonia, non-specific interstitial pneumonia, organizing pneumonia, bronchiolitis obliterans, and hypersensitivity pneumonia. She also specializes in lung diseases associated with rheumatologic disorders, such as rheumatoid arthritis, dermatomyositis, mixed connective tissue disease, and scleroderma
