EDUCATION AND SUPPORT: THE SCLERODERMA FOUNDATION AND ITS CHAPTERS OFFER EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS TO INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE SCLERODERMA AND TO THEIR CAREGIVERS AND FAMILY MEMBERS WHO ARE ALSO IMPACTED BY THE LIFE CHANGES CAUSED BY THE DISEASE. THE FOUNDATION'S ANNUAL "NATIONAL PATIENT EDUCATION CONFERENCE", IN RECENT YEARS HAS BEEN ATTENDED BY OVER 670 INDIVIDUALS. RESEARCH: THE SCLERODERMA FOUNDATION FUNDED PEER-REVIEWED, SCLERODERMA RESEARCH PROJECTS. EACH AWARD WAS \$150,000 SPREAD OVER MULTIPLE YEARS. FOUR WERE TWO-YEAR ESTABLISHED INVESTIGATOR AWARDS, AND THREE WERE THREE-YEAR NEW INVESTIGATOR AWARDS. GRANTS ARE AWARDED FOLLOWING A PEER-REVIEW PROCESS THAT UTILIZES THE SAME SCORING METHOD FOLLOWED BY THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF HEALTH. THE PEER REVIEW PANEL IS COMPRISED OF INDEPENDENT SCIENTISTS, WHO DO NOT RECEIVE FUNDING FROM THE FOUNDATION. THEY REVIEW THE GRANT SUBMISSIONS INDEPENDENTLY AND THEN MEET TO DISCUSS AND DETERMINE FINAL SCORES. NEW INVESTIGATOR AWARDS ARE INTENDED TO HELP EMERGING SCIENTISTS GATHER SUFFICIENT DATA TO DEMONSTRATE THE VALUE OF THEIR AREA OF INVESTIGATION AND ATTRACT LARGER FUNDING FROM OTHER
